Itinerary

Day 1: Arrive Launceston - Bridport

Transfer to Barnbougle Golf Links Resort, one of Australia's top golf destinations and enjoy 18 holes at The Dunes, consistently ranked in the Top 25 in Australia. Carved out of an extraordinary coastline, Barnbougle is a true golfing treasure.

Lost Farm Lodge

Day 2: Bridport

Today, enjoy 20 holes at Lost Farm, Barnbougle's second course. Just a short pitching wedge across the river from The Dunes, Lost Farm promises a thrilling challenge for golfers of all levels. After your game, journey to the impeccably-restored Quamby Estate just outside Launceston, a charming mid-1800s homestead.

Day 3: Bay of Fires

Following an early breakfast, take the complimentary shuttle to Entally Lodge to meet your guides and a brief gear check. Head to Mt William National Park to begin the walk at Boulder Point, where sweeping views north to the Bass Strait Islands provide a taste of the iconic wilderness to come. Wind around secluded sandy beaches and rocky headlands while your guide regales you with local anecdotes. Arrive at Forester Beach Camp tucked away in secluded dunes. Take a dip, explore the dunes or simply relax with a glass of wine as your guide prepares a gourmet dinner (Walking approx 9km, 4 hours).

Day 4: Bay of Fires

Continue south today and marvel at the contrast of the blazing orange granite rocks and pristine beaches with dazzling blue waters. Lunch in a sheltered cove on the way to Eddystone Point Lighthouse. Traverse hidden coves and spy native animals on the marsupial lawns. Trek the final stretch of beach to arrive at the architect-designed Bay of Fires Lodge. Afternoon tea will be waiting. Find your spot on the deck for a warm foot spa and a cold beverage or two (Walking approx 14km, 7 hours).

Bay of Fires Lodge / BLD**Day 5: Bay of Fires**

Explore your way today. Spend an idyllic morning kayaking on Ansons River and a stroll over the dunes. Relax and spot whales and head out into the Tasman Sea. Or pamper yourself with a treatment at the lodge's eco-spa overlooking the Bay of Fires. Later, a feast with fellow trekkers of Tasmanian produce matched with fine local beer and wine.

Bay of Fires Lodge / BLD**Day 6: Launceston**

Explore nearby beaches and headlands, sink into the outdoor tub, or curl up with a book from the lodge's library. Later, venture through the fragrant eucalypt forests and coastal heathland before a forest lunch to the sound of native birds, including the endemic green rosella. Return to Quamby Estate (Walking approx 4km, 1 hour).



Bay of Fires Lodge



Set on a hilltop, 40 metres above the sea waves and surrounded by National Park, the Bay of Fires Lodge is the only building within 20km of outstanding coastal wilderness.

Enjoying views up and down the pristine white sandy beaches in an area of great significance to the Aboriginal community, a truly ecologically aware building has been gently let into the landscape. Two long timber and glass pavilions allow maximum connection to the landscape with minimum impact on the environment.

The lodge is autonomous in providing and managing its existence. Experience true communion with nature in an accommodation that combines the simplicity of design with comfort and warmth. All accommodation at the Lodge is twin or double share, with king size mattresses.

In the magnificent living area with its large timber deck and open fire, enjoy delicious meals prepared with fresh local produce, accompanied by fine Tasmanian wines. Solar power provides the lighting, while hot showers and comfortable hotel beds add a touch of luxury at the end of the day.

There is an outdoor spa and a small library which is comfortable and cosy looking out over the ocean. This is a great place to sit back and relax or look through the selection of books and magazines.

- 130 feet above sea level, the views from the lodge are incredible

- Located in the middle of nature with minimum impact on the environment as the Bay of Fires Lodge was constructed out of local materials and is solar powered
- The service, food and comfort is impeccable. Featuring a library and an outdoor spa
