Journey Overview

Visit Murchison Falls National Park, spotting a myriad of wildlife including hippo, elephant, buffalo, lion, as well as a huge array of birdlife and of course the Murchison Falls, known as the most powerful waterfall in the world. In Kibale Forest Reserve, track chimpanzees in the wild, spot tree-climbing lions in Queen Elizabeth National Park and at Bwindi Impenetrable National Park bed down at the luxurious Sanctuary Gorilla Forest Camp, your base for gorilla tracking adventures.

Itinerary

Day 1: Arrive Entebbe

On arrival, transfer to your stylish new boutique hotel nestled in the leafy suburbs.

Day 2: Entebbe - Murchison Falls National Park

Depart Entebbe and fly to Murchison Falls National Park, one of the most scenic spots along the Nile and the location of the classic Humphrey Bogart film, *The African Queen*. After settling into your lodge on the banks of the Victoria Nile, join your guide for a visit to Murchison Falls, where invigorating spray — the collective force of the majestic Nile — showers a narrow ravine.

Day 3: Murchison Falls National Park

Today, set out on a game drive along the northern banks of the Nile in the heart of Murchison Falls National Park. You may see giraffe, buffalo, elephant, warthog, leopard, lion and antelope. This afternoon, embark on a boat cruise to the base of the falls, watching for hippo, crocodile, elephant and birds on the river's banks.

Day 4: Murchison Falls National Park - Kibale National Park

After breakfast, board a flight to Kibale. Set against the backdrop of Lake Kyaninga and the mystical Rwenzori Mountains, Kibale has one of the highest diversities and concentration of primates of any park in Africa. It is home to a large number of endangered chimpanzees, as well as the red colobus monkey and the rare L'Hoest's monkey.

You will be met on arrival and transferred to Primate Lodge. Nestled right in the heart of Kibale Forest National Park, Primate Lodge features just 10 beautifully decorated, spacious luxury cottages with large verandah offering excellent views of the forest.

Day 5: Kibale National Park

Kibale is one of Africa's premier destinations for chimpanzee tracking. Today you will head out with your tracker in search of these engaging creatures. The forest is also home to over 300 species of bird, with six endemic to the park, and other mammals including leopard, rare forest elephants, buffalo, giant forest hog and half a dozen species of antelope.

Primate Lodge / Meals: BLD

Day 6: Kibale National Park - Queen Elizabeth National Park

Drive south to Queen Elizabeth National Park. The game density here is high and it supports some of the largest herds of elephant in Uganda. There is prolific plains game and a good number of predators.

Ishasha Wilderness Camp / Meals: BLD

Day 7: Queen Elizabeth National Park

At Ishasha, game drives through the park by day and night are included. Resident wildlife includes Spotted hyena, leopard, hippo, elephant, buffalo, waterbuck and a population of tree climbing lions.

Day 8: Queen Elizabeth National - Bwindi Impenetrable National Park

This morning continue south by road to Bwindi Impenetrable National Park. Arrive at your luxurious Sanctuary Gorilla Forest Camp, with ten elegant tents situated uniquely inside the national park, meaning you are only minutes away from the start of your gorilla tracking adventure.

Days 9-10: Bwindi Impenetrable National Park

Bwindi is home to many primates including colobus monkeys and chimpanzees but is most notable for its population of the critically endangered mountain gorilla. Spend the next two days trekking through the forest to locate one of the habituated gorilla families. The walk is demanding, up and down steep forested slopes and through thick jungle vegetation, however sighting the gorillas in the undergrowth is an inspiring moment! Spend time observing the family as they interact with each other, play and forage.

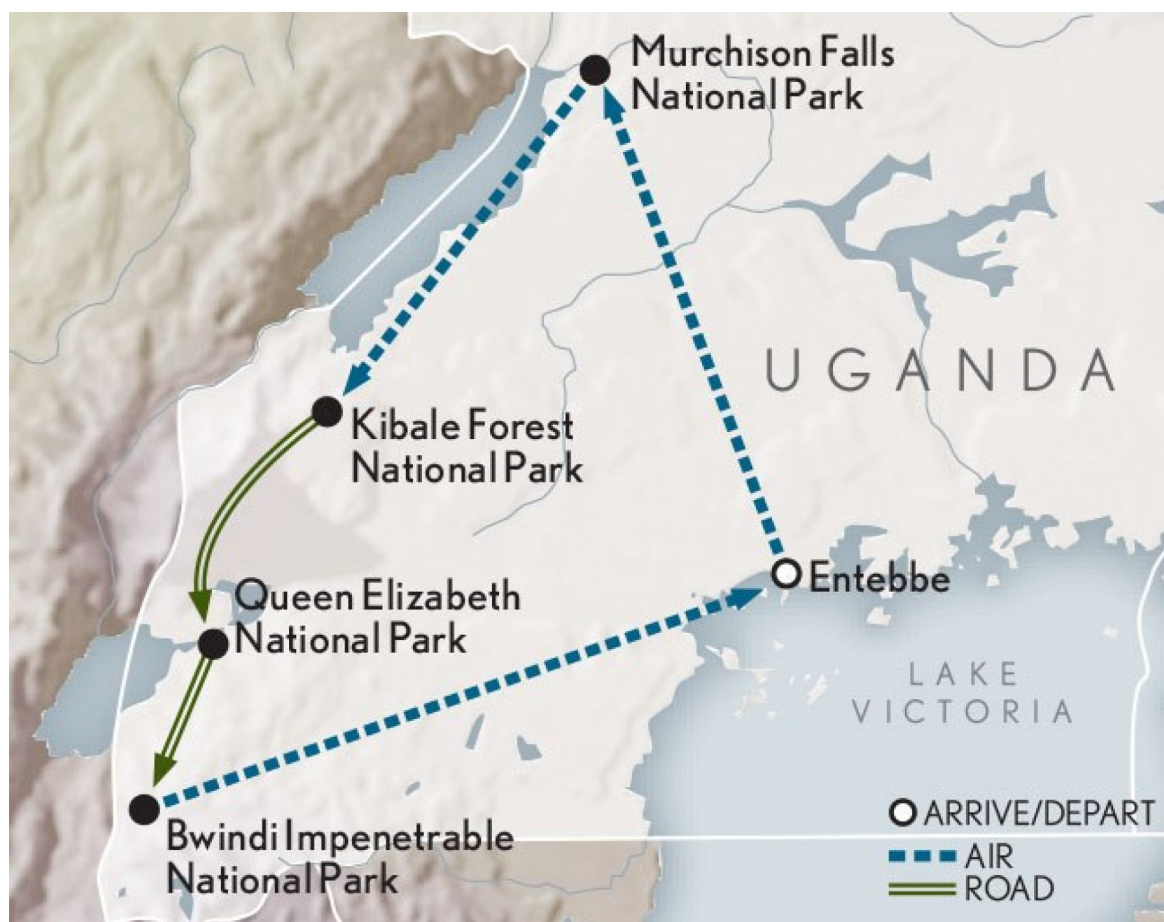

Ishasha Wilderness Camp



Ishasha Wilderness Camp is an exclusive tented camp that offers quality accommodation in the unspoilt remote southern sector of Queen Elizabeth National Park. Each of the ten East African meru styled tents are situated in the wooded area besides the Ntungwe River. They are comfortably furnished with each with its own dressing area and private en suite bathroom providing hot water "bush" showers and an eco-friendly toilet. The central dining area which is under thatch is a relaxed area to enjoy meals and relax after a full day safari. There are excellent game viewing opportunities, with buffalo, elephants, kob, topi and other species of antelope all common.

Sanctuary Gorilla Forest Camp, Bwindi Impenetrable Forest



Located deep in the Bwindi Impenetrable Forest in western Uganda, this intimate lodge offers luxury in the midst of one of Africa's most amazing natural environments. A UNESCO World Heritage site, Bwindi is one of the most biologically diverse areas on earth including 113 species of mammals (including a herd of the rare forest elephant), 200 species of butterfly and over 360 species of birds. In addition, Bwindi is home to seven species of primates of which the most endangered is the elusive mountain gorilla. Only 700 of these magnificent animals remain worldwide and Bwindi is home to just over half of them.

Gorilla Forest Camp has a bar and dining cottage as well as a natural raised platform for open-air dining. At night, a traditional African campfire is lit where the gorilla briefings take place. Cuisine and service has been described as the best in Uganda. Experienced guides will accompany you on your gorilla trekking where a maximum of eight visitors are allowed to each gorilla family group. Tracking can take anything between half an hour and up to nine hours dependent on the family you are visiting. You will also be trekking at altitudes of 5200 feet so a good level of fitness is required.

Why we like it

- Perfect luxury base to go gorilla tracking
- Other activities on offer include bird watching, forest tracking and visits to the local market and villages
- Eight spacious tents on raised wooden platforms with en suite bathrooms
- A superb mini spa offering various treatments and massages
- Children are welcome at the camp but only children aged 15 and above are able to track the gorillas
