## Day 2: Amsterdam

This morning is for the artists. Begin with an expert guided tour of the iconic Van Gogh Museum, drinking in some of the artist's most famous works and the work of those who followed in his artistic footsteps. Continue your art appreciation on a tour of the Rembrandt House Museum, taking the opportunity to explore the artist's home and creative epicentre. As you make your way through the property, discover impressive paintings and priceless belongings that have been reunited since the auction following Rembrandt's bankruptcy in 1656.

# Day 3: Amsterdam

Start your day exploring Amsterdam's historic city centre with your expert guide, before admiring the city's stunning architecture as you float along the capital's famous canals on a 90-minute private boat cruise. Returning to terra firma, channel your inner art aficionado as you revel in the stunning collection of 17th century Golden Age masterpieces housed in the beautifully restored Rijksmuseum.

# Day 4: Amsterdam - The Hague & Delft - Amsterdam

Today you dive into beautiful Delft, a small town outside of Amsterdam renowned for its famous blue and white pottery and attractive architecture and landscapes. Take in the town's gorgeous buildings and charming ambience, visiting the Nieuwe Kerk (New Church), boasting the second tallest church tower in the Netherlands. Continue to the Vermeer Centrum where you uncover the history of Johannes Vermeer, the Dutch Baroque painter behind the famous "Girl with a Pearl Earring" and a host of other 17th century masterpieces.

After lunch at leisure, continue to Den Haag, exploring the Mauritshuis Museum which houses impressive works by Rembrandt, Steen, Hals, Rubens, Van Dyck and many other Dutch artists.

## Day 5: Amsterdam

Enjoy a full-day sightseeing in Gelderland, discovering The Hoge Veluwe, the province's national park. Admire the Kroller Muller Museum and a significant collection of Van Gogh pieces, some inspired by the surrounding landscapes. Stroll through the sculpture gardens appreciating works by Rodin, Moore and Hepworth, before heading west to visit the nation's largest moated castle, the impressive Kasteel de Haar. A true fairy tale castle, explore the stunning interiors with your guide and discover the fascinating history of its inhabitants before returning to Amsterdam in the late afternoon.

## Day 6: Amsterdam - Antwerp - Bruges, Belgium

This morning, embark on a full day journey to the UNESCO World Heritage city of Bruges via Antwerp. Upon arrival in Antwerp, enjoy a guided tour of Rueben's House, a museum celebrating renowned Baroque master Peter Paul Rubens. The museum, housed within the artist's old residence and studio, showcases an impressive collection of his works and the tools used to bring the pieces to life. Afterwards visit the Museum Mayer van den Bergh, home to the collection of art dealer and collector Fritz Mayer van den Bergh, boasting impressive works from the Gothic and Renaissance period in Belgium and The Netherlands.

## **Day 7: Bruges & Flanders**

Explore with your expert guide as you meander along the charming treelined canals and cobbled streets, passing the Church of the Holy Blood, and the Markt with its soaring belfry, one of the tallest and most beautiful in the region. Be struck by the architectural beauty of medieval city hall and the Church of Our Lady, home to Michelangelo's superb sculpture of the Virgin and Child. Around the corner is the Old St John's Hospital complex, with the Memling museum celebrating the work of artist Hans Memling within its former chapel.

Enjoy your afternoon at leisure or choose to participate in a guided tour of the family-run De Halve Mann Brewery, learning the secrets behind creating the perfect blend of malt and hops before taking part in a tasting (additional cost).

#### Day 8: Bruges - Ghent - Brussels

Today, travel east to Brussels, Belgium's thriving cultural capital. Along the way, stop off in the beautiful city of Ghent, admiring magnificent medieval quarters and Gravensteen, the splendid 12th-century castle reminiscent of former glories. Wander in awe of the masterpieces within St Bavo's Cathedral before a lunch at leisure. Bidding farewell to the Flanders region, you may choose to enjoy some of the famed local waffles or chocolate before continuing to Brussels.

#### Day 9: Brussels

A medieval old town contrasted with impressive modern architecture, Belgium's capital is sure to intrigue. Begin with a visit to the Grand Place, the magnificent square at the heart of the old quarter. Considered one of Europe's most ornate market squares, the opulent guildhalls and impressive Breadhouse tower above the bustling crowds. Close by is Brussels' most famous resident, the Manneken Pis, a bronze emblem of the bold nature of the city. Venturing further afield, visit the Horta House, dedicated to the Art Nouveau architect Victor Horta and based in his old residence. Finally, on the edge of the capital lies the landmark structure of the Atomium, atop which you can drink in spectacular views across the city.

# Day 10: Brussels

Led by your expert guide, discover one of the city's most prominent art museums, the Musee Oldmasters Museum. Part of the Royal Museums of Fine Arts of Belgium and originally founded by Napoleon Bonaparte in 1801, the museum collection celebrates European painters from the 15th to the 18th centuries.

# Day 11: Brussels - Vianden Castle - Luxembourg

Leave Brussels behind as you continue to charming Luxembourg. En route, visit Vianden Castle, one of the largest and most beautiful medieval residences in Europe constructed on the foundations of a Roman 'castellum' and a Carolingian refuge. Continue to Echternach, Luxembourg's Little Switzerland, with an afternoon to explore the local wonders at your leisure.
