Itinerary

Day 1: Arrive Kuala Lumpur

Arrive in captivating Kuala Lumpur to a warm A&K welcome and a private transfer to your hotel in Malacca.

Tonight, take to the streets of Malacca's heritage-listed town to discover the best local food on a guided tasting tour, exploring on foot and by colourful rickshaw. Taste a variety of different dishes influenced by the Malays, Indians, Chinese and Arab traders, and gain a better understanding of Malacca's eclectic culinary culture.

The Majestic Malacca | Meals: D

Day 2: Malacca - Kuala Lumpur

Visit key historical and cultural sites of the UNESCO World Heritage city of Malacca. Discover the diverse cultures of this former colonial outpost including the Peranakan culture, unique to the straits of Malaysia.

Embark on a guided exploration of local icons steeped in history, from the oldest remaining example of European architecture in Southeast Asia, a famosa (Portuguese style fortress), before climbing St Paul's Hill to St Paul's Church and continuing to the Stadthuys — the impressive former Dutch City Hall.i

Next, pay a visit to the Baba & Nyonya Heritage Museum (open Thursday to Sunday), a journey into the late 19th-century and early 20th century Malaya home. Still managed by the family and where four generations of straits-born Chinese family lived since 1861, this place honours the Peranakan spirit.

This afternoon you will continue to Kuala Lumpur with the evening at leisure.

Day 3: Kuala Lumpur

Take a closer look at the blends of cultures and history, old and new, that define the city of Kuala Lumpur.

Visit the colourful Thean Hou Buddhist Temple the tropical Lake Garden , and the magnificent white stone National Mosque and railway station. In the colonial Merdeka Square of admire an array of architectural wonders, with buildings dating back to the late 1800s. Continue your discovery with visits to a plethora of galleries, including Asia's largest museum of Islamic art. Wrap up your wanders with a visit to the majestic Masjid Jamek, also known as Friday Mosque, one of the oldest buildings in Kuala Lumpur which gracefully sits on the banks of two rivers. Wander around the mosque grounds, learning about Islam in Malaysia and the arabesque influences in its design.

Day 4: Kuala Lumpur - Cameron Highlands

Discover a sanctuary of Hindu culture, the Batu Caves hidden on the outskirts of the city.

After climbing the 272 steps that lead to the Sanctuary of Murugan, one of the most revered deities of Hinduism, you can enjoy a splendid panorama of the city, in the company of the resident monkeys who are sure to entertain. After your cave explorations, continue by private transfer to Cameron Highlands and settle in at your resort.

Day 5: Cameron Highlands

Today enjoy an immersion into the Cameron Highlands famous tea plantations. Enjoy a tour of the nearby tea plantation before a short guided trek in the misty Mossy Forest of Mount Brinchang admiring the array of exotic plant life as you go. Afterwards, enjoy a tour and tasting at the tea factory.

Wrap up your tea immersion with an afternoon tea at the elegant Jim Thompson Tea Room, named after the famous American who helped revitalize the Thai silk industry.

Day 6: Cameron Highlands - Ipoh

After breakfast transfer to Ipoh, Malaysia's third-largest city with a reputation for a thriving arts scene. Stroll through the charming laneways, admiring the shop houses and restored colonial buildings, eyes peeled for the famous interactive street murals and Ernest Zacharevic's street art, a name synonymous with the famous street art of Georgetown, Penang. A culinary melting pot of flavourful delights, enjoy stopping to taste the city's local delicacies.

Continue to your hot spring resort for an evening at leisure. If you so choose you may partake in an optional fine dining experience, within a 260-million-year-old limestone cavern, suffused with romantic light and exquisite setting. Located at your retreat, Jeff's Cellar is surrounded by a lush tropical rainforest valley, cascading waterfalls and thermal hot springs. The culinary delights are sure to satisfy, paired with an extensive range of organic and rare wines from around the world (additional cost).

Day 7: Ipoh

Day 8: Ipoh - Penang

Journey to Penang, travelling deep in the hills of Teluk Bahang towards Balik Pulau, visiting the fascinating to Art&Garden an expansive green sanctuary showcasing an amazing variety of plant life amidst glass, clay and metal sculptures as well as paintings and colourful mosaics.

If you so choose, you can enjoy an insider access guided exploration alongside the talented Fuan Wong, a gifted glass artist and coordinator this spectacular outdoor gallery and garden (additional cost).

From here transfer back to Georgetown, stopping enroute in the quiet town of Balik Pulau to admire three spectacular murals that represent local life. Enjoy lunch and a visit to the local creative market where you can stroll the stalls of handmade pieces. Continue to Penang and end your day's adventure with a walking tour and rickshaw ride to Georgetown's street art, with whimsical paintings and sculptures as well as interactive murals inspired by daily life.

Day 9: Penang

Today you'll embark on a guided walking tour of Penang, immersing yourself in the fascinating world of the Straits Chinese. Pass by the incredible Cheong Fatt Tse Mansion, a landmark heritage building in the UNESCO World Heritage city of George Town, St. George Church, the oldest Anglican *Church* in South East Asia and the High Court.

After a photo-stop in front of the Capitan Kling Mosque, visit Khoo Kongsi and its intricate carving, woodwork and porcelain décor, once part of the set for the famous movie Anna and the King. Continue to admire a myriad of ancient temples and monuments, each with a fascinating story and captivating history. Your last stop today is the Clan Jetties of Georgetown originating from settlements of Chinese immigrants. Take a stroll in their narrow wooden paths surrounded by decadent charm, continuing through the old town, stopping to admire some of the architectural wonders that earned the town a UNESCO World Heritage status.

If you would prefer, you can embark on a bicycle tour, cycling through the centre of Georgetown and admiring heritage sites, traditional trades and enjoying the hawker meals at some of the city's best-known shops (additional cost).

This evening also offers an optional sunset canapes experience, with a guided walk through The Habitat on Penang Hill, amidst breathtaking highland rainforest, the treetop walk culminating in an indulgent sundowner as you watch the last rays of the day wash over the picturesque panorama below (additional cost).

Day 10: Penang - Langkawi

Today you'll visit the impressive Buddhist Temple Kek Lok Si, one of the largest and finest temples complexes in Southeast Asia. Afterwards transfer by air to Langkawi Island. On arrival, be transferred to your hotel and enjoy a rejuvenating complimentary massage at the onsite spa.
